Mike's love to entertain and his love for children made him a great teacher not only in the classroom but around the campfire and at the festivals. Mike recognized that the Tottenham Bluegrass festival was a great outing for families and that starting a children's program was something the festival needed to incorporate. In the early days, Mike created a program for the kids and dressed

up as a clown and entertained the children not only with music but entertaining stories bringing smiles to the young and old.

He also recognized that our festival goers wanted to engage more with the entertainers and learn from them. And from that, he started the Tottenham Bluegrass Workshops, along with his pal, Al Benner,. The workshop continues today bringing together entertainers and festival attendees so they could share their knowledge and love of the music

As that is what Bluegrass is all about, THE JOY OF MUSIC. From jamming around a campfire to the door of the RV to the Monday night jams at Man of Yorke to the halls of the local Legions, senior homes spreading the magic of music was something Mike was passionate about. ...
